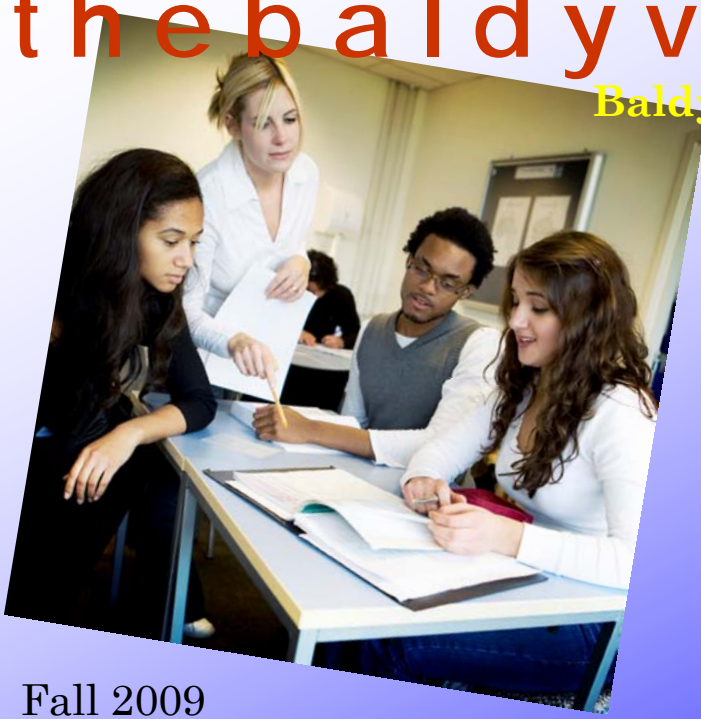

Foundation awards scholarships to nine ROP students

The mission of the Baldy View ROP Foundation is to help students achieve their educational and professional goals. Offering financial assistance is just one of the ways the foundation supports its students.

Among 29 applicants, nine ROP students were awarded foundation scholarships ranging from \$200 to \$1,000. The recipients were selected based on their educational and professional background and experience, community service, and demonstrated financial need. These criteria were scored by a panel consisting of three foundation board members.

What is Baldy View ROP and what does it offer?

Baldy View ROP is a California public school agency that provides career technical education and services to high school students and adults who are interested in improving their opportunities, and attaining training/certification.

Baldy View ROP was established in 1972 and is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. It is a joint venture of the Chaffey Joint Union High School District, Chino Valley, Claremont and Upland Unified School Districts.

There is no cost for high school students who participate in ROP. Adults are charged a registration and material fee.

Baldy View ROP is affiliated with over 600 business and community partners for educational, collaborative and financial support. The Baldy View ROP Foundation - through fundraising, donations and grants - is a major resource to ROP students.

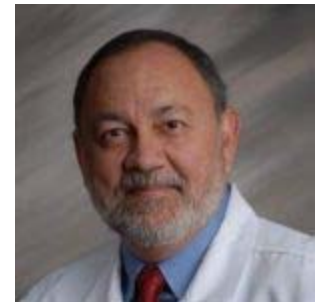
