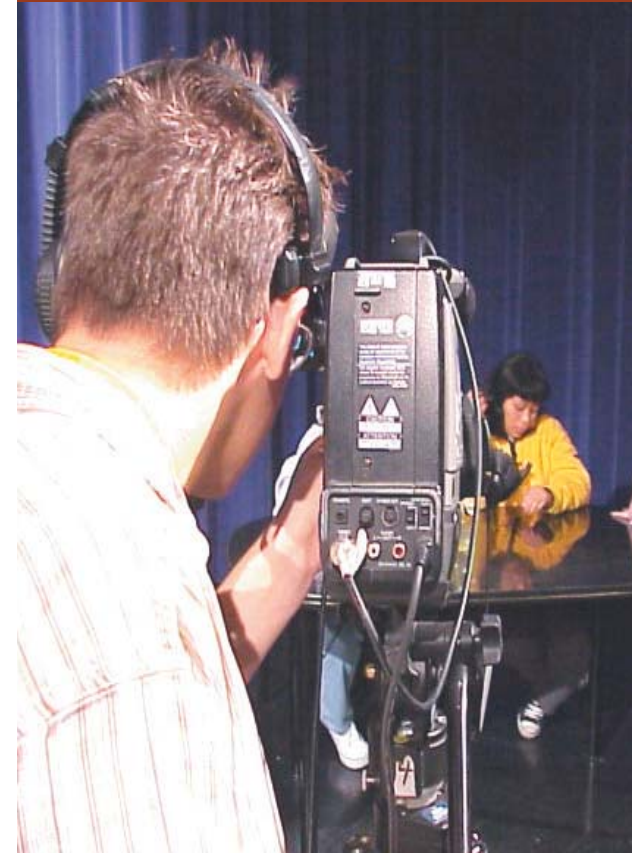

VIDEO PRODUCTION



A career preparation program designed to provide related instruction and practical experience.



WHAT DOES THE PROGRAM PREPARE ME TO DO?

Video Production - This course is designed to provide students with skills in the development and production of video programs. The training includes equipment operation, stages of production, producing, directing, scripting, computer graphics design, and extensive hands-on experience with video production and digital editing equipment.

Pre-Apprentice Advanced Video Production - This program builds on the skills and knowledge gained in the ROP Video Production course. This course will refine those skills, but emphasize the areas of producing, directing, scriptwriting, advanced production techniques, computer graphics applications, editing and much more.

You will create numerous types of programming including news magazine, drama, documentary and music video productions. The goal is to produce a “demo reel” that features your own creative work. This is an essential employment tool for getting a job at a broadcasting or cable station, production company, or in-house corporate facility.

BEHIND THE SCENES

As you watch a television show or movie, you see the actors in front of the camera. But you also see and hear the creativity and craftsmanship of professionals who work behind the scenes. Scriptwriters provide the story. Production designers and construction crews build the sets. Composers create soundtracks. Graphic artists design titles. Producers manage the bottom line; directors have the vision. Audio, lighting, and camera crews get it all on tape. And editors put it all together.
